

















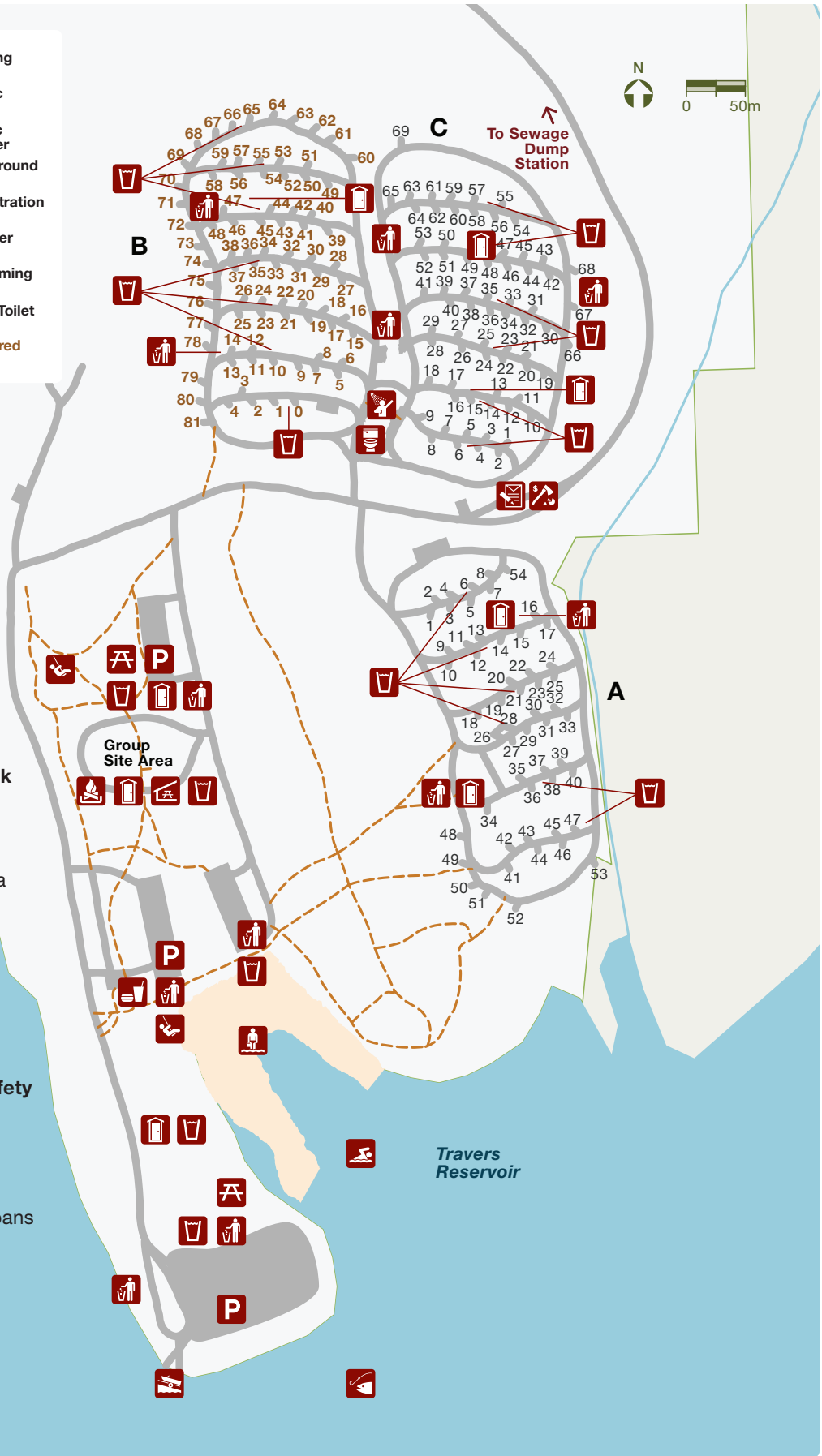

Welcome to Little Bow Provincial Park

Enjoy the atmosphere and beauty of Travers Reservoir and the surrounding hills from the shade of the cottonwoods. Little Bow is an ideal setting for camping, boating, swimming, fishing, bird watching and picnicking.

Nearby, Lake McGregor, Little Bow Reservoir and Travers Dam Provincial Recreation Areas have boat launches and day use facilities for your enjoyment.

Safety

- The beach has no lifeguard. Children must be supervised at all times.
- Beat the heat; stay hydrated and in the shade when possible, wear a sun hat, loose fit clothing and sunscreen.
- For the safety of both swimmers and boaters, please obey all signs at boat launches and on lakes.
- Boats used on any water body must conform with the *Canada Shipping Act* and regulations.
- Please do not block any roadways to ensure a safe flow of traffic and access to all areas.

Camping

- Keep your campsite clean; recycling and garbage containers are available throughout the campground.
- The maximum number of camping accommodation units, motor vehicles, and towed equipment permitted on a campsite is three, and only two of these may be used as sleeping quarters (accommodation units).
- A maximum of 6 people may occupy a campsite UNLESS they all are members of the same family unit.
- Exception: if two tents are used as sleeping quarters (accommodation units), two motor vehicles, or one motor vehicle and one piece of towed equipment are permitted on the campsite if it is large enough.
- The camping fee is charged for each accommodation unit on a campsite, unless one or both of the accommodation units on a campsite are tents.
- **A campsite must be large enough to accommodate the maximum number of allowable units.** Depending on a campsite's

design and dimensions, the campground may decide that only one camping accommodation unit may be assigned to that campsite. Call the campground directly to find out if a second unit will be permitted upon check-in.

- **Guaranteed check-in time:** 4:00 p.m. (same for comfort camping)
- **Check-out time:** 2:00 p.m. at individual campsites
- Quiet time is from 11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.
- Consider your neighbours, keep generator use to an absolute minimum. Respect quiet hours and posted generator hours.

Parking

Park in designated parking areas or on the graveled portion of your campsite. Please do not park vehicles or trailers on the grass.

Pets

- Pets are allowed in Alberta's Provincial Parks and Protected Areas.
- Dogs must be kept on a leash, no more than 2m in length, in campgrounds and day use areas and on trails.
- With the exception of certified partner dogs accompanying people with disabilities, pets are **not allowed** in public:
 - Swimming areas
 - Beaches
 - Buildings
- Please pick up after your pets.

Wildlife

Little Bow Provincial Park is located in the McGregor Lake and Travers Reservoir Important Bird Area. The peregrine falcon, an Alberta Species At Risk, has historically nested along the north shore of the western arm of Travers Reservoir. In spring and fall, watch for migrating birds in the cottonwoods along the reservoir. Fish species in the reservoir include brown trout, burbot, emerald shiner, lake whitefish, longnose sucker, northern pike, northern redbelly dace, rainbow trout, shorthead redhorse, spottail shiner, trout-perch, walleye, white sucker, and yellow perch.
