Field Study Fees and Cancellation Policy:

\$125 per field study, maximum of 24 students. Payment is accepted by cheque . Once payment is received, the field study booking is confirmed. Your payment is refundable for

cancellations requested at least 1 week before the program or in the event of inclement weather. Available: December—March

Class size:

The field study is designed for groups of 24 students with one adult volunteer assistant for every five students. Groups larger than

24 can be accommodated, but arrangements need to be made ahead of time, if snow shoes are not required.
